At every possible time throughout this year we will remind ourselves as to

why we do what we do- as a Catholic School of excellence and improvement that expects all staff and students to be reflective learners with a growth mindset. Moreover, as we pursue our goals in improving reading, writing, problem solving (numeracy) and mirroring Christ through prayer, students and staff will apply the Learning Inquiry Model in implementing learning plans and achieving learning goals.

Many parents would have heard their children use terms like Learning Advisor, Learning Groups and the Learning to Learn programme over the last week. Changes in the pastoral arm of the school will allow for greater emphasis on the notion of personalised learning for student growth. Our aim is to have all students reflect more on how they learn which will mean students making right choices over why and when

they learn.

Finally, we launched the BYOT (Bring Your Own Technology) program at the end of last year. With the Commonwealth Government terminating the DER (Digital Education Revolution) 1:1 Laptop initiative, St Clare's is responding by allowing students to use a device that suits their learning needs and accommodate a personalised learning platform.

From the Assistant Principal..... Mr M Whitton

I extend a warm welcome back to all members of the Clare community. I trust that everyone had a relaxing break (even though it seemed to rush by much too quickly!). 2014 looks to be another huge year, however, that seems to be the case every year these days. In lots of ways, it will be a year of consolidation. Our focus on prayer formation continues to build, with this year's particular focus being on the value of Prayer in our daily lives, which is an effective value to follow the 2013 focus on teacher formation. Striving to be a peacemaker to one another is an ideal that we should all keep close to our hearts and will be a regular topic of conversation here at St Clare's this year. Our academic successes will continue to grow, as we continue with our implementation of Writing and Numeracy. We also have seven Year 10 students selected to commence Preliminary HSC studies in Legal Studies and Advanced English at Loyola Senior High School. Our continued emphasis on each and every student at St Clare's striving to achieve their personal best is of the utmost importance.

In terms of personal safety here at school, can I take this opportunity to remind both students and parents of the importance of taking care in Buckwell Avenue at the start and finish of each school day. The

pedestrian crossing near the school bus bay should be used by all students when crossing the road. Before and after school it is important that parents do not enter the school grounds to pick up their son/daughter. Please arrange to meet in the surrounding streets. The main car park and the back car park are not places where parents should be dropping off/ picking up their child. Morning supervision commences at 7:55am. The school day ends at 2:30pm and staff are on supervision in the bus bay until 3:00pm. Could I also ask that parents discuss personal security with their children, so that our students are aware of their surroundings when travelling to and from school. We want our students to be safe at all times.

This year, our school day commences at 8:15am with our Learning Group. If a student is late, then they must report to the School Office at Student Services. Students must have a note that explains their lateness to school. We expect all our students to adhere to our school uniform and grooming policy as stated in each students planner. As always, we appreciate your assistance in helping us to maintain a high standard of uniform worn by our students. When we work together, this is easily achieved and St Clare's students stand out in the community as young people to be admired.

This year we are commencing with a new structure around Student Wellbeing. Each Wednesday morning students will participate in a Learn to Learn class. The Students Wellbeing Program provides students with strategies to develop their living, learning and thinking power and provides you with the resources to help them!

Each week the program will focus on one of the five categories: Career and Management, Personal Health, Relationships, Reseacrh and operational skills and Study Techniques and Approaches.

Inspired ideas adapted from "Clare of Assisi- A heart full of love." by Sr. Ilia Delio.

St Clare and St Francis left a world of status, wealth and security in their search for God. They found that poverty was something to be sought after as it demanded a total dependence on the generosity of God and others for their very survival. This seems opposite to what most people value today. We want to be in control of our lives by having wealth. St Clare and St Francis however, found that through the Incarnation, god was able to empty self and become human like us in all things except sin and became Jesus. Being poor, Jesus was free to wander

around preaching, by words and actions relying on the donations of others. St Clare and St Francis tried to imitate his life and did as combined they revealed God through being masculine and feminine, active and contemplative, missionary and mystical. Francis was free to preach through an active lifestyle while Clare

remained for about forty years in her monastery. She wanted to be a missionary but the Church at that time did not want nuns to wander around preaching. Clare however, wrote widely and her word spread large distances and is still with us today. Some of her letters reached Agnes of Prague who like Clare was born into nobility and gave up all to follow in the footsteps of St Francis. In one letter Clare tells Agnes to "gaze upon him (Jesus), consider him, contemplate, as you desire to imitate (Him)." She challenges us as well to look at the life of Jesus, consider his words and actions and follow his

example. If we live as Jesus lived then we would I reflect his life to all we meet. St Francis said preach to others and if you have to, even use words. Our actions should speak much louder than

St Care was a very determined woman. She was the first woman in history to create the rule for her sisters and stood her ground when the Church at the time wanted to make life for her easier. For her poverty was they key to generosity and dedication to others for their well-being and relationships, dependence on god

and imitation of Jesus.

Dear Lord, both St Care and St Francis left a world of status, wealth and security in their search for you. Help us realise that we need others for healthy living. Keep our eyes open to the trap of thinking that money, power or status will bring us happiness. Help us accept that healthy relationships occur when we value ourselves and others. Help us realise that in life, it's not the size of your house that will lead to joy but the size of your heart in relationship with others.


