Extract from the Reading of the Day

31 It is like a mustard seed which, at the time of its sowing, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth.
 32 Yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.' (Gospel, Mark 4:26-34).



Every Day at School Counts

Yesterday I received a report generated in December 2016 that our student "Attendance Level" was calculated at 65.2%. Given the average for our diocese if 80.1%, our level is somewhat concerning. So many students are missing out on their learning and are playing catch up with their studies or simply falling behind.

Our focus this year is to improve our attendance level to at least 90%. We all need to have high universal expectations as this is critical a student's achievement progress and wellbeing. Please see Mrs Nielsen's report below that visually represents how a poor level attendance impacts on a student's schooling. With your support we can turn this statistic around.

School Action Plans for 2017

As part of our ongoing Strategic Plan and Improvement Plan all schools across our diocese have been asked to generate plans for Literacy, Numeracy and Formation. Our school goals for 2017 are as follows:-

Formation / **Religious Education** - By the end of 2017, students will develop a deeper understanding of the Gospel Matthew with a particular focus on the charism of St Francis and St Clare.

Literacy - To improve the reading comprehension skills of each student in Stage 4, by meeting or exceeding of Pat-r norms, within the October 2016 - October 2017 PAT-R testing periods.



Numeracy - To increase Years 7 and 8 students' mathematical understanding and competence, particularly in the domain of multiplication and division. All Year 7 and 8 students to progress a minimum of one growth point in the domain of multiplication and division by the end of 2017; all targeted students in the EMU program to progress a minimum of two growth points by the end of 2017.

We will endeavour to keep you informed of the progress we are making on these goals as part of our end of term communications. We will also be holding workshops to work shoulder to shoulder with parents and guardians to promote how you too can work with us to support your ward in achieving these highlighted goals. More information will provided via a "Parent Education Learning and Engagement Sessions" we will be running this term. As your child's first educator we seek your support and input into these sessions. These most likely will be twilight sessions to accommodate work and family commitments.

OPAL Card



Students who were issued with an Opal Card last year need to carry this with them from the start of the school year. Opal Cards will not be reissued like the older style bus passes. All families would have received information packs from Transport NSW if there was an issue with your child's bus pass for 2017. St Clare's Anxiety Management Group

Parents and students at St Clare's have been invited to participate in an anxiety management group, to be conducted as part of a research study through The Department of Psychological Medicine at the Children's Hospital at Westmead, in partnership with Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP).

The student group will run at school for one hour per week for ten weeks in 2017, and will be facilitated by Lauren Forwood, St Clare's School Counsellor, and an additional psychologist from CEDP. The group will consist of a series of mindfulness and acceptance based activities to teach children various skills to learn how to deal with anxiety.

For students to participate in the group, parents will initially be required to complete some screening questionnaires and also attend a short interview with one of the researchers to answer questions about their child's anxiety. Once the group commences, parents will also be required to attend two evening information sessions, one at the beginning and one half way through the group program.


CONGRATULATIONS YEAR 7 AARON SMITH
