Even if these staff members are unable to give you an immediate answer, they will deal with your concerns and get back to you.

PARENT CONTACT LIAISON

In order to facilitate improved communication with parents, we created a position last year to support this work. The Parent Contact Liaison for the start of the year will be Ms Mea Brown. You will note that at this point she is listed as the Learning Mentor for Kolbe House. She has been appointed to this role initially so we can streamline the way this currently works to make this as effective as possible. At the start of the year, you may well receive a phone or email contact from her as a reminder about a school process or seeking your feedback. All the information that is collected is carefully analysed and communicated to key members of staff.

COMPLAINTS

Please be aware that if you would like to make a complaint about anything here at the school, there is a set process for this that involves your complaint being registered. This means that the handling of this complaint is monitored and evaluated. You always have the right to make a complaint directly to the Principal.

SAFETY

We have very clear expectations regarding the way that students are to relate to one another. It is very important that you inform us of situations that may concern you about your child's safety. This allows us to respond as quickly as possible if this is required. It is important that you help us to ensure that our community **does** not accept bullying and threatening behaviour or racist, homophobic and discriminatory language. If you believe that any such a matter is <u>not</u> being dealt with appropriately, please contact the school immediately. When you make this contact, make sure that you <u>explicitly state</u> that your call or email relates specifically to <u>your child's safety</u>. This will allow us to respond more effectively.

MEETING OUR STUDENTS' NEEDS (CASE MANAGEMENT)

It is important at the school that we work systematically to meet the needs of our students who may experience some difficulties in learning. This could be as a result of a variety of things. In order to support our students, we have introduced a special case management approach. FAMILY-SCHOOL LIAISON

COUNSELLING

Please be aware that the school has a full-time Counsellor. *Ms Lauren Luthra* offers our students and families wonderful support. Please do not hesitate to contact Lauren at the school if you have any concerns or would like some advice. All of our students are able to self refer if they feel they need to. Through Lauren we are able to access, through Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP), a variety of different services including family counselling. THE IMPORTANCE OF ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL

We are always concerned when students are unable to attend school for whatever reason. The research is very clear on the damage that is done to any student's learning if they are not regularly attending school. If there are reasons that your child does not want to attend school, you need to contact us immediately. Please do not fall into the trap of thinking that it will be "good" for your child to have the odd day off. Students will often get into this habit and the effects are evident in their learning. If you require any support with ensuring that your child attends school regularly please do not hesitate to contact the Leader of Learning Pathways so that we can support you. During the course of the year, the School may send letters home informing you about your child's attendance rate.

Last year we appointed Ms Rhiannon Marsh to support students who are having difficulty attending school. Her role involves providing detailed data for staff and developing important correspondence for parents. We are particularly interested in tracking student improvement in this area.

RESPONSES TO DEFIANT BEHAVIOUR

Defiance is defined as the "refusal on the part of a student to follow a reasonable instruction given to them by a staff member". Students will be cued to the fact that they are being "defiant" in an effort for them to modify this behaviour. Defiance is not tolerated in the work force and will not be tolerated at St Clare's Catholic High School. The normal consequence for defiance is an "out of school" suspension. Students demonstrating this behaviour will immediately be withdrawn from the class or playground. A student suspended for defiance will not return to the College until a meeting has been conducted between the parents and the College Principal or one of our Assistant Principals.

MOBILE PHONES IN CLASS

- All mobile phones are to be left in students' bags during lessons.
- All mobile devices are to be switched OFF at all times during classes unless the teacher expressly
 instructs students to turn them on and use them.

If the student is seen to be using a phone in class, they will be asked in the first instance to put this in their bag. If they continue to use the phone and/or refuse to put it in their bag, they will be asked to go to the front office and surrender their phone for the remainder of the day before returning to class. If they have been defiant regarding the use of their phone they will be removed from class and parents will be contacted.

The aim of this is to stop students distracting themselves by constantly checking for contact from others. If parents need to, they should only contact their children via their mobile phone **during recess or lunch times**.

STUDENTS WITH SIBLINGS AT HASSALL GROVE PUBLIC SCHOOL

Please note that all students who have to pick up siblings from the Primary school will have to wait in Town Square until the bell goes for the end of the school day at the Primary school. Students are not to be waiting at the front of the school or inside the Primary school grounds.

IMPROVING LEARNING THROUGH FEEDBACK

This year you will notice a change in the method used by teachers to assess your child's learning. We will be concentrating on providing the very best possible feedback in an ongoing way. This means that we will not be using a series of formal tasks predominantly completed at home to assess students' learning in Year 7 to 9. Year 10 - 12 will complete some formal tasks to meet NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) policy and guidelines.

There will be opportunities throughout the year to meet your child's teachers and to receive further communication. You are encouraged to attend these events to inform your dialogue at home about learning occurring at school and any decisions your child may need to make.

DIFFERENT SCHOOL COMMENCEMENT TIMES ON TUESDAY MORNINGS

On Tuesday mornings, the school will rotate through different activities every three weeks. Approximately **twice each term** school will not start for **all** students until 9.05am. You will be notified of this via regular correspondence. This is also indicated in the Student Diary. During this time one or more of the following activities will take place:

- a full Staff Meeting;
- parent and student interviews;
- rehearsals for performances;
- coaching for sports teams;
- learning and homework support groups

Students will be informed if they have an appointment or group to attend. **All other students must be at school no later than 9.05am.** Supervision will be available for all students from the usual time on these days until Learning Groups starts.

Please note: Students who regularly fail to meet our expectations for uniform and grooming <u>will not</u> be eligible for a late start on these days.

THURSDAY MORNINGS - PERIOD 1

This year we have built into the timetable a period each week, Period 1 on Thursday, to help build community and eventually provide some time for students to be involved in high interest activities of their choosing. At the start of the year we will meet as a school however eventually this time will be used for a variety of activities.

THE RETURN OF CORRESPONDENCE GIVING PARENTAL PERMISSION FOR ACTIVITIES

Reminders about the submission of notes will be included in notices. We expect students to be organised and submit these notes on time. Those who do not submit these on time will not be allowed to participate in the organised activity. We will, of course, make some allowance initially for our Year 7 students.

YEAR 7 CAMP

In Term 1, Year 7 students will attend a two night camp at the Great Aussie Bush Camp in Kincumber. The aim of this camp is for students to build strong, positive relationships with their peers and teachers. Students will participate in a series of team building tasks designed to challenge their comfort zone in a safe and fun environment.

HORIZON EXCURSIONS

Our staff will continue to offer what we will call "Horizon Excursions". These will be excursions to a variety of venues and activities for a small group of students (usually about ten), and will be conducted on the weekend or in the evening. These will be advertised to students, and the first students to indicate they would like to attend and return the necessary permission notes and money will be included. These excursions will include transport to and from the venue at no cost.

TECHNOLOGY

There has been a change in the way we will, together, provide the necessary technology for your child. All Year 7 students in 2020 will be provided with a Google Chromebook at the start of the year. This cost will be incorporated into your school fees and, in this way, we will be better able to monitor the effect of this cost on different families.

Your child will be responsible for the care of the device and, for all intent and purposes, it will be owned by them. For this reason, it is suggested that a laptop case / cover be purchased. Further parents / carers should consider taking out insurance on the device in the event that it is broken or lost.

Devices will be expected to meet the responsible use policies of Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta.

This change will mean that all of our Year 7 students will immediately have the necessary technology to access our network and begin their learning from the first day of the new school year. This has not been the case in the past and has caused real difficulty for families, our students and their teachers.

We believe this will be of tremendous benefit to everyone and will certainly take one more worry away from you in preparing for your child's start in high school.

UNIFORM AND GROOMING EXPECTATIONS

We believe it is important that both students and parents are aware of the school's expectations regarding our students' grooming and the wearing of their uniform. We believe that our students' uniform helps the local community to recognise them as a representative of St Clare's Catholic High School. As a member of this school community, it is beneficial to students that the College has a positive reputation in the community for the variety of different pathways and workplaces they may like to pursue. In this way, wearing of the school uniform is a visible sign of pride and commitment.

We understand that often you would be unable to check on your child before they leave for school as a result of your own work and family responsibilities. We believe that in the vast majority of cases that the students make specific choices about how they wear their uniform and they decide whether they will be meeting requirements or not.

Reasonable and consistent expectations apply to all of our students. We believe that these expectations should be easy to maintain. Unfortunately, students who regularly decide not to be groomed and dressed correctly will be ineligible for certain privileges.

These include being able to:

- take up future student leadership positions;
- represent the school at sporting events and/or be selected for representative teams on Gala days and in the PDSSSC competitions conducted on a Thursday afternoon;
- attend subsidised cultural and sporting excursions that will be conducted next year in the evenings and on weekends.

Students who decide not to wear the correct uniform will be subject to specific consequences which will lead to the loss of free time at lunch time or recess. A new detention system will also be introduced for a **one hour** period before school for repeat offenders.

Please note that on the day of any excursion, event or competition only students in the <u>correct</u> uniform whether that be a sport or cultural event, will be attending. This includes representative Thursday Sport and Gala Days.

Mufti

From time to time, students will be given the opportunity to wear mufti. The school's grooming will still apply on such days and students are expected to be neat and well dressed in clothing that is appropriate for school. The following guidelines apply:

- closed in shoes are essential (no thongs or sandals);
- no transparent / revealing clothing, no singlets or ripped clothing;
- no clothing with offensive language, inappropriate comments or images;
- · no midriff tops.

* Please note- school shorts with school name only. Sport uniform should only be worn on Thursdays or for certain school excursions (students will be notified of uniform expectations for excursions).

UNIFORM SHOP TRADING DAYS AND HOURS

Tuesdays 8.00am - 1.30pm (except school holidays)
Thursdays 12.00pm - 3.00pm (except school holidays)

In terms of grooming, the approach will be consistent for males and females in that:

- students are expected to be neat and well groomed;
- hair should be off the face at <u>all</u> times. Hair should not fall below eyebrow level at all times;
- there should be no hair on the collar long hair needs to be tied back in a red, yellow or black ribbon or tie. This is for both neatness and for safety;
- hair must be of a natural colour. Students may dye their hair but the colour/s must be natural and cannot be of extreme contrast;
- hair must be conservatively styled. Extreme styles which draw attention to the student are not permitted, some examples are mohawks, rats tails, dreadlocks etc.;
- in terms of piercings, students will be allowed to wear one set of earrings in each ear lobe and these must be sleepers or studs, these are not to be more than 1cm in diameter;
- one fine silver or gold bracelet and one fine signet ring may be worn;
- tattoos/body art are to be covered at all times;
- nail polish and acrylic nails are not permitted;
- makeup is not permitted;
- boys are expected to be clean shaven at all times;
- only the regulation school bag is to be used (see diagram on right);
- students are required to wear black hard-soled, leather, laced school shoes (see below).
- On sport days, students are required to wear sport shoes (not canvas).

Please note that the College Leadership Team will make the final decision about what is acceptable in terms of hair style or cut.
